- Essay Submission: Submit a well-written essay addressing the provided prompts.
- Fundraising Commitment: Applicants must be willing to actively participate in fundraising activities for community projects, events, and powwows.
- Dancing Experience: While not mandatory, a background or interest in ceremonial dance is highly encouraged.

- The Princess must be a current student
- The Princess must be able to represent Native C.O.R.E. at 5 public events or powwows that are approved by Native C.O.R.E. or Native Directions Inc. One must include the Three Rivers Indian Lodge Pow Wow
- The Princess must know Native American Culture and appropriate dances to the best of her ability and age
- The Princess must wear the Native C.O.R.E crown and sash at all events when representing Native C.O.R.E or Native Directions Inc.
- Must be able to fundraise by selling Fundraising Tickets for \$1 each. (*Selling tickets is only a *portion* of the judging criteria.)
- Must be drug and alcohol free
